Deborah Re, the CEO of Big Sister Association of Greater Boston, was awarded the **Harriet and Alan Lewis Changing People's Lives Award** by **Grand Circle Foundation (GCF)** at the annual foundation dinner held at their South Boston offices.

The award recognizes a leader who has achieved outstanding results in the face of

adversity and who has significantly impacted the lives of others through risk taking, entrepreneurial spirit, and leadership.

Upon receiving her award, Re shared her appreciation for Harriet and Alan Lewis' generosity and commitment to children's organizations throughout Boston. "I am grateful for Harriet and Alan's continued investment in Big Sister and their support for our mission. I know that they are going to push me, to challenge me to climb mountains, and to achieve excellence as a leader. But they will not ask me to do it alone; they will be right there with me."

As part of the award, Re will receive a trip for two anywhere that Overseas Adventure Travel or Grand Circle Travel has programs. The Foundation will also give \$25,000 to Big Sister.

Past winners include **Andrea Howard**, Executive Director of the West End House Boys & Girls Club, **Erica Jamison**, Executive Director of **City on a Hill**, and **Susan Rodgers**, CEO of Artists for **Humanity**.

For example, she values the High School Mentoring Academy as a creative solution to serve more girls in Dorchester.

She is buoyed by the commitment of Big Sister to remain a girl-serving organization and is impressed by the board, management, and staff's dedication to the mission. When asked what she hoped for the future of Big Sister in the next 60 years, her primary desire is for the organization to continue to focus on girls.

12th Annual Celebrity Chef @ Radius Raises \$157,000 to Support Little Sisters

The ambience was bright and lively as old and new friends gathered at **Radius** for Big Sister's twelfth annual **Celebrity Chef Dinner** on Sunday April 10. One hundred and twenty guests came to support Big Sister and to sample the culinary delights of six of Boston's most talented chefs. Owner, renowned chef and long-time Big Sister supporter, **Michael Schlow**, hosted the dinner and made guests feel like they were at a family gathering.

Chef **Jamie Bissonette** (**Toro** and **Coppa**) kicked off the meal with tuna crudo, coupled with charred and pickled ramps, sunchokes, celery and fermented black beans. **Dante de Magistris** (**Restaurant Dante** and **Il Calsale**) served a rich pasta e fagioli made with mafalde pasta, octopus, pine nuts and grappa-soaked raisins. Not to be outdone, **Stella's Evan Deluty** plated Atlantic salmon over a spring pea timbal made with a morel mushroom broth. Breaking with

the seafood theme, **Seth Raynor** (**The Pearl**, **Corazon del Mar**, and the **Boarding House**) presented arepas, topped with red chili pork, and dressed with a guasacaca sauce, cotija, sour cream, cilantro and lime. The fifth course, created by **Radius'** own **Matthew Audette**, was a slow-roasted veal sirloin teamed with truffled pommes purée, spring vegetables and a lobster vinaigrette. **PJ Waters**, also of **Radius**, finished the meal with a coconut rice pudding with passion fruit gelato, prickly pear sauce and crispy soba noodles.

In between courses, emcee **Lisa Hughes** of **WBZ-TV** enlivened guests and congratulated Big Sister on mobilizing 170,000 volunteer hours in 2010 to mentor girls. Former Little Sister **Jesse Kwan** recounted the life-changing impact of her Big Sister **Jackie Church** on what was the 22nd anniversary of her immigration to Boston from Hong Kong. Whether it was helping Jesse apply (and get into) Boston Latin Academy or encouraging her to learn new languages, Jackie

was a steadfast and motivating force for Jesse.

"To the woman who taught me the importance of wearing socks and gloves in the Boston winter time,... who showed me to stand up for myself, who taught me to take smart risks, who taught me everything good that is in me, that if I work hard enough in life, that I might just accomplish my feats and defeat my innermost insecurities. If it weren't for her, I would never summon enough courage to talk to you today.

After Jesse's eloquent speech, guests were given the opportunity to take girls off our wait list. Moved by notes written by girls all over Boston who wanted a Big Sister who could be their friend, who could alleviate their loneliness, who could make them laugh or even help them learn English, attendees collectively pledged \$52,000, enough to take 52 girls on our wait list. Altogether, **Celebrity Chef at Radius** raised \$157,000 and will enable us to serve 157 more girls in 2011.

We wish to extend our gratitude to **Michael Schlow** and his fellow chefs for creating a delightful culinary experience. Special thanks are in order for board members, **Max Bardeen** and **Sharon McNally**, who have served as event co-chairs for two years in a row and whose tireless efforts made the event such a success. Match Highlight: A Father's Perspective

FATHER DANIEL COLLINS SPEAKS ABOUT HIS DAUGHTER AOIFE'S FRIENDSHIP WITH BIG SISTER LEIGH



Appassionata, enlightened, and revealing: the three words Daniel Collins uses to describe his daughter Aoife, her Big Sister Leigh Doherty, and their relationship.

When **Aoife** (pronounced "ee-fa") first started kindergarten after moving to Boston from New York with her father, **Daniel Collins**, she knew there was something different about her family. She was one of the few children in her class in a single-parent household and perhaps the only child who did not live with her mother.

him, Amelia and Aoife's mother. Leigh is more like a "favorite aunt," which is exactly what he was looking for.

Daniel admits that two years ago there had been several rocky moments for his non-traditional family. He is grateful for the ways in which Leigh acted as ballast for Aoife through those tough times.

"It would be difficult to overstate how important it was for Aoife to have a friend like Leigh to whom she could talk during those stressful days. I suppose that every family goes through such occasional periods of uncertainty. But for a child in that situation, having one reliable friend providing emotional continuity and stability ... can make all the difference between "one of those unpleasant things we all have to go through" and "a full-blown emotional disaster." Leigh's handling of the situation as it developed was careful, effective and, most importantly, always directed at Aoife's best interests... So three cheers for Leigh."

In the two years since they've been matched, Leigh has helped reveal the qualities and strengths that he knew his daughter had in her, but wasn't sure would get the chance to emerge. When asked to describe Aoife, Daniel chose *appassionata*, an Italian word, because "an English word just won't do" to sum her up. "She's a very warm-hearted person" he says. "She has the soul of an artist."

He notes that she is very perceptive to the feelings and motivations of others, a talent that she has started to channel into theater. At 11, he's seeing that she is really starting to come into her own. As he watches her confidence bloom, Daniel credits Leigh with helping foster these positive changes.

"My daughter is my hope for the future, my reason for getting up in the morning... so it's wonderful to see."

Seeing the impact this was having on his daughter, Daniel reached out to Big Sister in 2009. While he had been co-parenting Aoife with a close friend, **Amelia Stiles**, he recognized that his daughter yearned for additional female influences in her life. In wanting a Big Sister for his daughter, he wasn't looking for a replacement for her mother, who currently resides in Augusta, Maine. Rather he wanted to expand the network of adults who could help guide her through childhood.

Daniel, an only child himself, thinks back to his youth surrounded by his father's large family in western Massachusetts. He remembers his Uncle Jimmy Collins who had been a major influence on him, with much fondness. "It's one of those things that you carry with you for the rest of your life." He wanted his daughter to enjoy and benefit from this type of relationship with a caring adult. **Big Sister Leigh Doherty**, who Daniel describes as "enlightened," has certainly fit the bill.

"Leigh fills a role that no one else in our circle could," says Daniel. Her relationship with his daughter is very different from those Aoife has with

Lemonade Day Gives Little Sisters A Taste For Small Business

On May 1st, Little Sisters accompanied by their Big Sisters set up lemonade stands all over Boston as part of Lemonade Day, a national event dedicated to inspiring young children to be entrepreneurs by teaching them how to operate their own small business.

Big Sister Association of Greater Boston pairs girls ages seven to fifteen with a caring and supportive mentor who can help them realize their full potential. During the course of their mentoring relationship, a Big Sister will introduce her Little Sister to many new ideas and possibilities for her life and career that she might not have otherwise considered. Big Sister Association actively seeks partnerships and opportunities that provide enriching experiences for the girls we serve. It was with this in mind that we partnered with **Babson College**, along with Boys and Girls Clubs of Boston, Friends of the Children - Boston, and Boston Centers for Youth & Families to bring Lemonade Day to Boston for the first time.

With the help of a mentor, the young entrepreneurs were shown how to establish their business, including setting goals, and creating and executing a plan. Most importantly, the exercise tries to teach the participants basic financial management and includes a component of philanthropy. The children are encouraged -- after covering their expenses and paying back their investors -- to open a youth savings account so they may save a little, spend a little and give a little, donating a portion of their profits to a local charity of their choice.

Big Sister Stefanie Magner reports, "**Mariana** and I had a wonderful day, and

can't wait to participate in Lemonade Day again next year. My favorite part was watching her learn, and really begin to put things together and understand all of the pieces involved in running a business. I also think community involvement is very important. It was so wonderful to see how excited she got every time someone came up to buy lemonade, especially one of her school teachers who visited the stand because of a flyer she gave to him. It was like watching her realize that she is important."

Mariana selected Children's Hospital Boston as her charity of choice. "We are planning on going [Friday] to bring the money in person, because I want her to experience giving in person," says Stephanie.

Little Sister Patricia similarly enjoyed learning the different steps of running a business with her **Big Sister Amanda**. She is donating her \$91 profits to a team racing in the annual Pan Mass Challenge.

After four hours of selling to happy customers, **Little Sister Nailea** didn't want the day to end. Her **Big Sister Erin Mahoney** reports "She kept convincing me to make a little more lemonade for a few more customers. Not only did we have a great time together, but I was really proud of Nailea for grasping the concept of 'spend, save, give.' She found self confidence in being able to buy a new outfit for herself, gifts for her family, and still have money to save. We plan to hold a summertime lemonade stand when school is out. Nailea wants to use the money she earns to take her mom out for a special lunch."

High School Mentoring Academy Big Sister Honored

Big Sister Vanessa Tabuteau named "Young Shero" by City Councilors **Ayanna Pressley** and **Felix Arroyo** for her dedication to mentoring.

Ask **Little Sister Maya** who her "shero" is and she will tell you it is her **Big Sister Vanessa Tabuteau**. For more than two years, Vanessa, a busy high school student, has been a consistent presence in Maya's life. Each week, Vanessa spends an hour outside of her schoolwork and extracurricular activities to be Maya's mentor. If it were not for caring young women like Vanessa, girls like Maya would not have Big Sisters in their school.

When Big Sister Association launched our High School Mentoring Academy in 2007, it was in response to a need for mentors at the Trotter Elementary School in Grove Hall. The school's location makes it difficult for women working in the city to travel conveniently to and from the school during the day. The solution lay just around the corner -- literally. Dorchester's Boston Latin Academy, an exam school comprised of students from around the city, was just down the street; its high-achieving pupils would make ideal mentors. Sophomore to senior girls meet with elementary school-aged girls at the Trotter, on a weekly basis.

Vanessa, now a senior, became a Big Sister in her sophomore year. She is committed to being a role model to a girl growing up in her community, a girl in whom she can see a younger version of herself. Whether it is playing a board game, reading a book, or just talking, she is giving Maya the support and attention she needs to believe in herself. Maya may not know the answer to every math problem, but she does know that once a week she will walk into the school library and her Big Sister will be there just for her.

Leslee asked her Little Sister 13-year old **Aleysia** of Cambridge to be her "Sister of Honor" and Jon asked his Little Brother 17-year old **Bryant** of Dorchester to be his "Brother of Honor" in their wedding which occurred Saturday May 21, 2011 at St. Thomas Chapel in Falmouth Heights.

"Once we decided we wanted to be married, we decided we wanted them in the wedding," Jon said last week. "They're such an important part of our lives, like family."

Deborah Re, CEO of Big Sister Association, notes that such stories of Littles being part of their Bigs' wedding are fairly common.
