A Collaborative Effort to Help Get #Girls2Great

An Interview with Danielle Morrissey, Principal of Blackstone Innovation School

Big Sister Association has partnered with the Blackstone Innovation School since we launched our School-Based Mentoring program in 2001. A long-standing partner, Big Sister has recognized school administrators as Partners of the Year throughout our collaboration.

We are thrilled to have matched 40 Blackstone students with a Big Sister in the most recent academic year. Principal Danielle Morrissey is a strong advocate for our combined effort to get girls to great. She was appointed school principal at the start of the 2013-2014 school year, the first year after the school became an Innovation School. She leads a very talented and highly committed staff.

Why did you choose to partner with Big Sister?

Historically speaking, the Blackstone has partnered with Big Sister for at least 10 years now. Due to the strong partnership over the years, and the benefits it has provided for our students, we have continued with this partnership.

What does an ideal collaborative effort look like?

An ideal collaborative effort looks like both the partner organization and the school having open and ongoing communication about how things are going with the program. Both parties have a mutual understanding and a common goal ensuring that students are served and

matched with positive adults that can make an impact/difference in a child's life.

Last year, we matched and supported 40 girls at the Blackstone with a Big Sister. What impact has mentoring had on the girls at the Blackstone? Have you noticed an improvement in behavior and/or aspirations?

We have seen positive trends with girls in Big Sister's School-Based Mentoring program in terms of student

There are two highlights from my time at SEPA that come to mind. The first is the growth and experience I gained as a leader. During my time at SEPA, I played a significant role in the development and achievement of large-scale strategic initiatives that not only resulted in fundraising growth, but also organization wide success. The second highlight was being a Big Brother. It was a life changing experience to serve as a mentor to my Little Brother Ashante and it gave me a tremendous amount of perspective into why mentoring organizations like SEPA and Big Sister are so important.

Big Brothers Big Sisters network and further a cause I truly believe in compelled me to explore Big Sister. I also saw an opportunity, as a man, to bring attention to an organization serving women and girls. Currently, only 7% of philanthropic dollars go to girl-serving organizations, and to me that is not right.

Big Sister Association is making a profound impact for girls in Greater Boston through its gender-specific mentoring model and that is something that everyone should get behind.

Why is mentoring important in the Greater Boston community?

Many of us have had a mentor who has helped guide and shape who we have become. Unfortunately far too many children, particularly in impoverished areas, do not have the benefit of a mentor. Often, all it takes to set children on the path to success is one extra person in their life believing in them, and having expectations for them. I look at the large scale problems facing too many in the Greater Boston area as solvable through mentoring, one child at a time.

Do you have a mentor?

My two professional mentors are both women and they have had a tremendous impact on me both personally and professionally. They have helped to shape my career and given me guidance when I have needed it most.

What role do men and boys play in helping women and girls realize their full potential?

The challenges facing girls today are not just a female issue, but a human issue. We all need to play a part in helping build the confidence and character of girls, in an effort to transform our communities. The work of Big Sister Association isn't just nice, it is necessary.

If you had to describe Big Sister's new strategic development approach in one word, what would it be?

Advocacy — Our strategic approach to development is to build strong and enduring relationships with individuals, organizations, and communities who share our passion for helping girls in Greater Boston reach their full potential.

What is your favorite thing about being a part of the Big Sister community?

Big Sister Association has a tremendous staff who are smart, competent, accomplished, and extremely dedicated to the mission and work of Big Sister. A strong organizational culture is hard to find, but I have found one with Big Sister.

Big Sister Paola Villatoro Honored by Foundation To Be Named Later

An Interview with Big Sister Paola Villatoro, recipient of the Foundation To Be Named Later's Peter Gammons Scholarship and Big Sister to Little Sister Janaya.

This competitive scholarship program began in 2010 in partnership with RISO, Inc. to grant high-potential, yet low-resourced, Boston-area high school students a four-year scholarship. In its fourth year, the Peter Gammons Scholarship has awarded 29 students the opportunity to pursue higher education at the college of their choice. Paola was chosen from 50 applicants during the competitive review process.

Big Sister Paola Villatoro has been matched with her Little Sister Janaya, who recently completed fifth grade at the Trotter Innovation School, for two years. Paola has worked consistently to encourage her Little Sister to grow. Although Paola's Little Sister can be very quiet and shy, Paola has demonstrated maturity and patience in connecting with her through games, conversations, and crafts. She is a leader among other high school Big Sisters, and invaluable to her peers who are new to mentoring.

You've been awarded a four-year scholarship to a college of your choice. What are your plans for the scholarship?

The scholarship money will go toward my tuition at the University of Massachusetts, Boston.

What are you looking forward to most about college?

Exploring! In high school, we are restricted from exploring a variety of classes. I want to do something in the business field, but that is so broad that I cannot wait until I can [experience] different classes. College is about discovering your likes and dislikes. I may think that Accounting or Finance is for me, but I want to have an open mind to other majors that may attract me.

What would you tell other Little Sisters aspiring to attend college?

Number one: Every human has a story, which means that all of us have obstacles. What makes us different is how we approach those obstacles.

Is there anyone who you would like to thank for the scholarship opportunity?

I want to thank Big Sister Association, Susan Johnson, and Allyce Najimy for giving me something priceless: opportunity. Big Sister Association gave me the opportunity to not only have my own Little Sister, but to become an influential part of a young girl's life. Big Sister allowed me to see that every little bit can make a difference, just like Susan made a difference in my life. Susan, [Big Sister Coordinator of High School Mentoring], was more than just supportive. It's like she knew I was going to get the scholarship from the confidence she had in me, which made me believe in myself. I am beyond grateful for the opportunity that

Number two: Pity should not be an option. You should not feel pity for yourself or want others to feel that for you. You want others to give you opportunities because they believe in you and because you deserve it, not because they "feel bad." There is no real reward in pity.

Number three: As females we should understand that we are a minority in the professional world, but understanding it, does not mean accepting it. Do not let the fact that we are a minority become an obstacle. Let it become an aspiration to be a part of change. If you are aspiring to go to college, do not allow anything or anyone to take that aspiration from you. As corny as it may sound, achieving any goal is about attitude and believing in yourself.

Most importantly, they all believed in me; there is nothing better than having people believe in you and open doors to give you an opportunity. Now, college is more than just a personal goal: it has become the shared goal of those who have given me the opportunity.
